We would like to welcome you and your child/ren to arrange an individual meeting time onsite with the class teacher. Wednesday	6 th April	from	3:40 to 4:20 pm

If you have met with or spoken to your child's classroom teacher recently and you don't think that it's necessary to talk again please disregard these meetings.

The 10 minute meetings are for the teachers to discuss a student's progress with parents. Specialist teachers will be available on the Wednesday should you wish to have a meeting with them.

Parent Teacher Interview times are to be booked through Compass. All parents should have received their log-in credentials for Compass. Please contact the school if you have misplaced this information.

Using this system you will be able to book the meeting times that suit you best from any internet connected device. If you do not have internet access at home or elsewhere please contact the office to arrange your interview time.

Online bookings will open at 3:00 pm on Friday the 18th March and close at 3:00pm Friday April 1st.

If you feel that you require additional time to discuss any other issues relating to your child, it would be appreciated if you make a further appointment with the classroom teacher by contacting the teacher direct. If you are unable to attend your booked appointment, please notify the office.

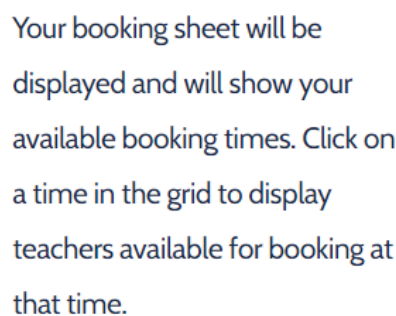
How to book via Compass

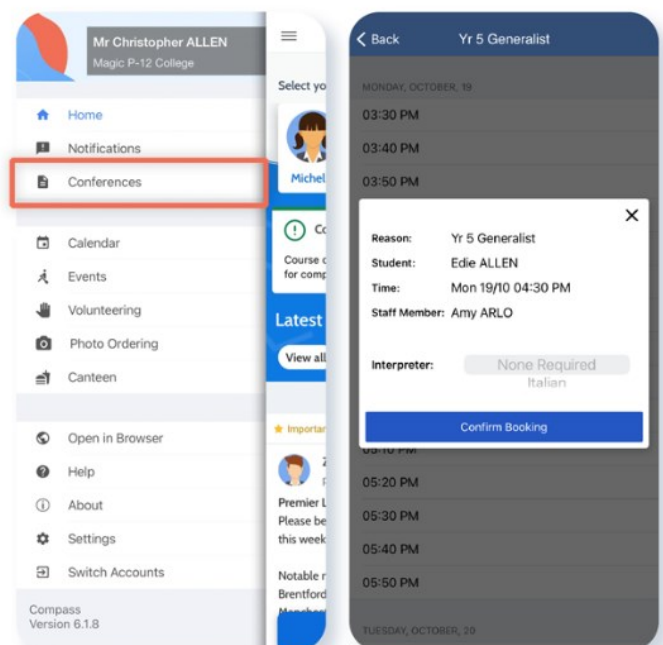
